

Beach trains now in service

With gas prices at record highs and parking costs at Southern California's beaches continuing to rise, inland residents will be eager to board the Riverside County Transportation Commission's (RCTC) Beach Trains. These special Metrolink charter trains travel toward beaches in San Juan Capistrano, San Clemente and Oceanside from train stations in Rialto, San Bernardino, Riverside and Corona.

Service began this year on June 26 and is offered every Saturday and Sunday through August 22. Service will not be available on the July 4th Independence Holiday weekend, and additional trains will run on Sept. 18, Sept. 25, Oct. 2 and Oct. 3. The round-trip fare is \$16 for adults and \$11 for kids under 16.

"This is a great way of taking cars off of the 91 Freeway on the weekends," said RCTC Executive Director Eric Haley. "More importantly, once people take the train to the beach and enjoy it, they often consider taking it to work as well."

This year, RCTC continues a number of effective marketing efforts to increase interest in the Beach Train. RCTC has joined a number of businesses in marketing partnerships to encourage Beach Train ridership. The effort has included internet banner ads and newspaper advertising. RCTC has also added a promotion on every Beach Train trip on weekends where there are no special events at the beach cities. For example, riders on the July 10 train will be entered into a contest for a Sunday brunch for two at the Thornton Winery in Temecula. This year, the Beach Train will also stop at additional stations in Orange County including Irvine and Laguna Niguel. The added stops will not change the overall schedule for the train.

"There is an added excitement and interest in the Beach Train this year," said Haley. "It makes sense because it is convenient,

affordable, and a lot of fun."



Rimes time

LeAnn Rimes performs at Soboba Casino

eAnn Rimes has been impressing audiences even before she could spell "audience." Before LeAnn Rimes was two years old, she was belting out songs like "You Are My Sunshine" and "Getting To Know You." By age five, she told her parents that she wanted to pursue a life in show business.

This talented singer brings her gifts to Soboba Casino on July 16.

Rimes made her stage debut in a Dallas musical production of "A Christmas Carol" and soon after the preteen powerhouse was singing "The Star Spangled Banner" at Dallas Cowboy games and opening for Randy Travis. She recorded her first album when she was eleven, "All That," which was released on a small, independent label. The fateful LP featured an early version of what would become her signature song, "Blue." Though the album was only available in local Dallas stores, the record created enough music industry buzz to attract the attention of Curb Records president Mike Curb. In 1996, LeAnn Rimes recorded and released her remarkable major label debut album, Blue.

Rimes' musical career has only risen higher since, with forays into acting as well. \blacksquare

DIRECTIONS TO THE TRACK

Coming from the west: Take either the Interstate 10 or 60 east-bound past San Bernardino or Riverside approximately 23 miles. Exit the first sign that says Beaumont (not Beaumont Ave.). This exit puts you on 6th Street, continue approximately 1/4 mile to the first stop sign and turn right on California. Proceed approximately 1/8th mile south and turn right on 4th Street (just past railroad tracks). Head west on 4th Street for approximately 3/4 mile and turn right into Moran Raceway.

Coming from the east: Take the Interstate 10 west and exit Beaumont Ave. and turn left. Proceed south-bound approximately 1/2 mile to 1st Street and turn right. Go 1 block to California Street and turn right, proceed north 1/8th mile to 4th Street and turn left. Head approximately 3/4 mile to Moran Raceway and we are on the right hand side of the road.

'Laughter' in Murrieta

Venture to Neil Simons '23rd Floor'

n Saturday, February 25, 1950, NBC introduced a brand new comedy show, which would revolutionize the entertainment industry. It was called "Your Show of Shows," a 90-minute comedy program conceived by Sid Caesar, which starred Caesar, Imogene Coca, Carl Reiner and Howard Morris in a variety of different sketches and comical skits.

"Your Show of Shows" was a television benchmark. Not only did it remain one of the highest rated programs of its day, it also laid the groundwork for the contemporary sketch comedy, and such programs as In Living Color, Mad TV, and Saturday Night Live. But perhaps the greatest success story of the show wasn't what occurred on screen, rather, the success it enjoyed off screen.

"Your Show of Shows" featured one of the most talented writing teams in the entertainment industry, and was the starting point for such renowned writers as Mel Brooks, Woody Allen, Larry Gelbart, Mel Tolkin, and Neil Simon.

Set in 1953, the play takes place in the writing studio of The Max Prince Show, located on the 23rd floor of the NBC tower. The play recreates the mayhem, neuroses, non-stop gags and constant one-upmanship of this team of brilliantly funny comedy writers, as they write television's number one variety show. Led by the show's star, the neurotic, irrational and oddly lovable Max Prince, they face the threat of rising McCarthyism and pressuring

NBC executives with the only weapon they have, humor.

Hailed as Neil Simon's "flat-out funniest play in years" (Dennis Cunningham-CBS TV), Laughter on the 23rd Floor is one of Simon's personal favorites, and now the Inland Valley can enjoy this comical masterpiece as it comes to Murrieta.

On Friday, July 9th, the award-winning Murrieta Repertory Theatre is presenting Laughter on the 23rd Floor for three weeks, from July 9th through the 25th. Please note, the show does contain adult language and is not suitable for younger viewers.

Murrieta Repertory Theatre was founded in January 2001 by local and award-winning artists, and is the first professional theatre company in the Temecula-Valley. As a registered 501 (c) (3) non-profit organization, Murrieta Repertory Theatre (MRT) is dedicated to enhancing the culture and quality of local communities; by bringing the greatest works of literature alive on stage.

Music from the spirit

Urban Gospel Series promotes positive entertainment

or families looking for uplifting enjoyment, the Riverside Convention Center will host three consecutive nights of musical entertainment with a positive message. Held nightly from July 14 - 16 during the Urban Gospel Industry (UGI) Awards & Conference, the concerts will showcase the music and the message of urban gospel artists and groups.

Scheduled to headline during the concert series are nationally known artists such as San Diego based hip hop crew Sackcloth Fashion, Sony Music's contemporary gospel group Ramiyah, Christian hip hop artist and Youth Pastor Fros'T, Jazz In The Spirit founder and saxophonist Ron Brown, vocalist and former "Girlfriends" co-star Cee Cee Michaela, and veteran Christian hip hop group Idol King.

Sponsored by the Urban Gospel Alliance (UGA), a national organization that brings together all facets of urban gospel music under one umbrella, the free concert series is a way to display to the local community

how gospel music has transformed over the years. With styles that appeal to youngsters, teens, and grown-ups, the series will bring family entertainment to the Inland Empire.

Each night features a new artist show-case at 7pm and a late-night showcase at 10pm. The new artist showcases will highlight some of the brightest up-and-coming artists from around the country in all urban music types, from hip-hop to contemporary to spoken word to jazz. Late-night showcases are focused on a specific genre of music and will highlight the talents of both new and seasoned artists alike.

While there are a variety of musical styles, the one thing that all the performers will have in common is a passion to use music to transform lives. "The unique factor of urban gospel artists is the message, not the beats, the music, or the production quality," Curtis Jermany, founder and national director of UGA, said.

"The various styles of music are just a vehicle - the artists that we are showcasing

are ones that have protected the integrity of the message that has been proclaimed to our forefathers and beyond," Jermany said. And protecting the integrity of the message is primarily what the daily sessions of the

UGI Awards & Conference is all about.

Seeking to educate conference participants on both the business and ministry of urban gospel music, UGA has laid out three full days of panels and workshops that provide information, networking, and accountability. Bringing in artists, industry personnel, and media from all across the country and from as far away as Nigeria, the conference is the first of its kind to unify these specific styles of gospel music.

Swingin' to 'Misbehavin''

small-time club act in the late '70s quickly caught on and has become one of America's most beloved musical revues. Ain't Misbehavin' pays joyous tribute to the talents of the legendary Fats Waller. From sassy to sultry, this electrifying celebration of song and dance features such favorites as "The Joint is Jumpin'," "Honeysuckle Rose," "I Can't Give You Anything But Love," and "T'Ain't Nobody's Biz-ness If I Do."

Experience the heart and soul of 20's and 30's Harlem where the onset of swing joined ranks with the rhythms of ragtime and the passions of jazz, creating an explosive musical movement.

The New York Times has called Ain't Misbehavin' "a funny, devastatingly beautiful, heart-stopping show." Ain't Misbehavin' opened as a limited-run cabaret act at the Manhattan Theatre Club on February 8, 1978, but was so well received that it soon moved to the

Longacre Theatre on Broadway. The show reproduced the atmosphere of a Harlem nightclub in the 1930's. The show ran in New York for 1604 performances.

In 1998 Ain't Misbehavin' played at the Candlelight Pavilion, and the audiences couldn't get enough of the cast's performance of "Keepin' Out of Mischief Now," "I've Got a Feelin," and "I'm Fallin." That cast lit up the stage at the Candlelight Pavilion with the swing, ragtime and jazz of the 20's and 30's.

With one exception, the cast from 1998 is back by popular demand after national and international tours of their own.



The IE's big apple

Oaktree Village offers the best of apple goodness

he Inland Empire's agricultural heritage usually focuses on citrus, but there is another small round fruit it's also famous for: apples. There's probably no better place to get your apple fill than at Oaktree Village in Oak Glen, the area's apple headquarters.

The Village is a 14-acre family entertainment park centered in the historic apple ranching community. Oak Glen is within an hour of most areas of the Inland Empire, making an excellent location for a quick family adventure.

The year's major festivals take place from April through December, during apple season. However, Oaktree Village also operates year-round.

Aside from a collection of restaurants serving lunch, dinner and, of course, apple pie, the Village offers a wide range of fami-

ly entertainment. Attractions include: music, craft fairs, fishing contests, petting farm, train rides, animal park and reptile cave, gold & mineral panning, pony rides, goat milking animal shows, a jumper, and face painting, plus shops and restaurants.

If you're taking little ones with you, they'll likely especially enjoy the Animal Park, which hosts more than 100 animals including pigs, goats, sheep, Asian pheasants, zebus, swans, peacocks, llamas, and more. New residents include an adorable set of Singing Dogs from New Guinea.

The Mountain Town Museum is another child-pleaser. Housed inside a 10,000 sq. ft. building, the museum is a re-creation of a mountain. A cave-like entrance opens up displays of animals from around the world, as well as the newly added Live Exotic Animal Exhibit.

With free general admission, free parking, and attractions in the \$3 range, Oaktree Village is a joy for adventure-seeking children and budget-conscious parents alike.

Oaktree Village is open every day throughout the year, except Thanksgiving and Christmas, from 10am to 5pm. All shops and restaurants are open from 10am to 5pm. Parking is free. The Animal Park costs \$3 per person, and includes the Petting Farm and Trout Ponds (there is a separate fee to fish). The Mountain Town Museum and Reptile Cave cost \$3 per person. ■
