# Latin Music Lights up SB

#### Jorge Santana beadlines bot-list of bands

owntown San Bernardino comes alive Sept. 18 with eight-hours of Latin concerts, headlined by Jorge Santana.

The musical extravaganza is part of the annual Latin Music Festival, which brings together a range of artists. This year's stage will be shared by Santana, Malo, the East LA Revue Band, The Village Callers "1966," Chico, Mickey Lespron, and the Best of Everything. The event will be hosted by Frankie Firme of KCLA FM radio, with comedy interludes provided by Gilbert Esquivel.

Event organizers listened to the requests of last year's concert goers and have expanded the dance area to two large floors to move to the live music.

Music veteran Jorge Santana headlines the show. Santana, brother of Carlos Santana, traces his musical career back to the late 1960s, when he started in blues rhythms. Santana has been a career musician ever since, performing, writing and producing.

The event takes place "under the stars" at the Arrowhead Credit Union Park, a baseball stadium offering plenty of space for concert-goers.




then Enoch Parrish planted his first apple tree in the foothills of San Bernardino in 1860 I'm sure he never envisioned that legions of families would someday flock to the Glen to enjoy sunshine and, of course, apples.

But the seed that Parrish planted wasn't just a crop, it became an Inland Empire institution. Word spread about the fertile land in the mountains, perfect for producing crisp, delicious apples. The farms are still there and still producing apples to everyone's delight.

Oak Glen has evolved over the years into an interesting blend of working farms and theme park. It's the perfect destination for families looking for an outing, with plenty of activities and interests for kids plus attractions for adults ... like great apple pie.

Oak Glen operates year-round, but the official apple season begins in September and runs through November. This is when you will find Oak Glen at its best, with plenty of apples, lots of variety, and bushels of country charm.

Oak Glen's attractions run from family-oriented activities to nature-inspired tranquility. Activities include: apple picking, trout



fishing, numerous restaurants and bakeries, live music, shops and crafters, western shows, cider mills to tour, panning for gold, festivals, petting farms, animal shows, Civil War re-enactments, nature trails, and more.

#### Oaktree Village

One of Oak Glen's family highlights is Oaktree Village, a one-stop activity zone that has all that's alluring about Oak Glen. The Village is a 14-acre family entertainment park with a collection of restaurants and a wide range of entertainment options, including music, craft fairs, fishing contests, a petting farm, train rides, animal park and reptile cave, gold & mineral panning, pony rides, goat milking, animal shows, a jumper, face painting, and shops.

I tested the Village out on my resident expert, Ally, my fouryear-old daughter. She took to the Animal Park right away, which hosts more than 100 animals from llamas and sheep to New Guinean Singing Dogs. For a quarter you can get a handful of food from a vending machine to feed the animals through the fence, another big hit with Ally.

We arrived just in time to witness a piglet race, and Ally was chosen as one of three piglet "coaches." She stood alongside the other children, yelling "soo-EEEE!" urging her pig on, and loving it. This kind of activity may not appeal to everyone, but to parents, it's gold. Luckily, if pig racing isn't your thing, there's plenty more to do at Oak Tree.

The Mountain Town Museum is another child-pleaser. Housed inside a 10,000 sq. ft. building, the museum is a re-creation of a mountain. A cave-like entrance opens up displays of animals from around the world, as well as the newly added Live Exotic Animal Exhibit.

Oaktree recently renovated its primary restaurant, Apple Annie's. Be sure to drop by and try their homemade apple pie and other mouth-watering selections.

With free general admission, free parking, and attractions in the \$3 range, Oaktree Village is a joy for adventure-seeking children and budget-conscious parents alike.

Oaktree Village is open everyday throughout the year, except Thanksgiving and Christmas, from 10am to 5pm. Parking is free. The Animal Park costs \$3 per person, and includes the Petting Farm and Trout Ponds (there is a separate fee to fish). The Mountain Town Museum and Reptile Cave cost \$3 per person.

#### Riley's Farm

If you not only love fresh apples, but American history, then Oak Glen has a unique attraction in Riley's Farm.

Riley's is a working apple orchard as well as a living history farm in Oak Glen. In addition to farming sweet corn, apples, raspberries, pears, and sunflowers, Riley's offers a venue for historical re-enactments comprising many different eras.

Every year, thousands of students participate in tours, where they experience everything from weaving, candle-dipping, and cider pressing to the drill and muster of a Revolutionary War or Civil War battle. Riley's has appeared on the History Channel and in the feature film, Amistad, as well as many other film and television productions.

Want to not just see the history, but live it? Riley's offers that too with a "Farm Stay" weekend. A family can experience the life of an 18th or 19th century American farmer, complete with authentic clothing, wood stoves, and muskets.

# Beers and Big Bear



s the leaves begin to turn and the temperatures start to cool down, the sounds of German polkas and sing-alongs fill the mountain air in Big Bear Lake. It is the 34th annual Big Bear Lake Oktoberfest, Southern California's most authentic German festival. For thirty-four years, Big Bear's Oktoberfest continues to entertain folks of

all ages and interests with traditional Bavarian music, games, dancing and food.

"We've been showing folks a good time for more than thirty years," explained Hans Bandows, Oktoberfest's Burgermeister (Master of Ceremonies). "We have families who now have second and third generations celebrating with us. It's all about letting your hair down and escaping from the everyday. When you leave with a smile on your face, we've done our job!"

The Big Bear Lake Oktoberfest began in 1970 when German immigrant, Hans Bandows, threw the first Oktoberfest in Big Bear. Bandows and his family had relocated to Big Bear from New York City. After their first year in Big Bear, the family decided it was time to throw a good old fashioned Oktoberfest to thank their new friends and clients. The townsfolk had such a good time, they asked Bandows to head up a community-wide event that has continued as Big Bear's largest special event for thirty-four years.

The Big Bear Lake Oktoberfest features the authentic good times of old Bavaria. The entertainment lineup this year includes the Appentaler Band, direct from Bavaria; a variety of German and Austrian dance groups; the annual Queen Stein Carrying contest; sing-a-longs, log sawing and stein holding contests, and the new Kinder Garten complete with a petting zoo and bounce house. Pleasure-seekers can take a stroll along the Budenstrasse (Avenue of the Booths) and shop for handmade arts, crafts and collectibles.

An Oktoberfest would not be complete without German beer and food. Big Bear's event proudly serves Lowenbrau Lager, Lowenbrau Oktoberfest and Lowenbrau Dark all imported direct from Munich, Germany. German meals include bratwurst, knockwurst, German potato salad and sauerkraut all made from original German recipes.

The festival takes place high in the San Bernardino mountains where the fall air is crisp and cool. A fall weekend in Big Bear Lake makes for a perfect weekend get-a-way from daily routines.

#### Big Bear film festival showcases top talents

Choppers setting the mood. Mr. Kovacs will also host a Q&A session, discussing three of his films, on Saturday, September 18th.



Mr. Perlman's credits are a tribute to his diversity and scope as an actor, including Enemy at the Gate, Blade II, Star Trek: Nemesis, CBS's critically acclaimed Beauty and the Beast (in which he played the Beast), and this year's Hellboy.

"The talent and the creativity of the writers and filmmakers who are participating are inspiring to anyone interested in the arts! We invite the whole community to spend all or part of their weekend with us to see these amazing films and to celebrate the artists who have added so much enjoyment to our lives," Monika Skerbelis, Director of Programming, said.

Ticket prices are a real value for all Festival events and activities. Tickets for the semi-formal Opening Night Gala at the PAC, including a cocktail reception, the presentation of Mr. Kovacs' award, and a national premiere film screening are \$25 each. The Wrap Party, with a barbeque dinner and the Filmmaker Awards Ceremony, also at the Performing Arts Center, is \$40. The full day Movie Pass is \$15, providing admission to unlimited films. General film screenings admission is only \$5, to be purchased at the door. The Screenwriting Filmmaker Panel on Saturday morning is \$15. Finally, there is an All Event Pass for the general public, with admission to all films and events for only \$75.



Dean has been involved with Inland Empire concerts for about 20 years and is the former host of Christian rock radio program Reality Rock, which aired for over 10 years on 89.1FM and 90.1FM. Reality Rock also promoted "Rock of Love" concerts at the Redlands Bowl and the University of Redlands' outdoor bowl in the late 80's and early 90's with artists such as the Altar Boys, Undercover, the Prayer Chain and many more.

"I believe there is hope for this generation of youth," Dean said. "And music is sort of a language that youth can relate to."

The message of 5 faith, hope and love ring loud and clear at every Ignite concert. The 7th annual Ignite will be held on Saturday, October 2, featuring rap artists Sackcloth Fashion and Priesthood with alternative bands Smithfield and Sanctifide. Ignite will also incorporate a city-wide skateboard contest organized by local freestyler Justin Romero, who has traveled around the world with Dean bringing their message of hope to schools in Australia, New Zealand, Scotland and Hawaii. Skateboarders can register for the competition at Calvary Chapel San Bernardino, also known as the Red Barn. Prizes and trophies will be awarded to winners in between bands at the concert. R
