





By 2001 they were a finalist in Billboard Music Awards for New Country Artist of The Year. It wasn't long after that they had their number one single "On A Night Like This."

In 2002, the trio was named Top New Vocal Duo/Group by the Academy of Country Music and Favorite New Country Artist by the American Music Awards.

Things didn't slow down for them the next year as they garnered a Grammy nomination for Best Country Performance By A Duo or Group for their song "Just What I Do."


An independent, non-profit, educational institution, The Air Museum "Planes of Fame" was the first permanent







He saved his pay and by the end of the summer had \$395 to buy his first dirt bike.

"I was on top of the world!" The then ten-year-old said he was so excited he couldn't sleep.


His parents used the bike to keep him on the straight and narrow. "Every time I screwed up, it was three weeks to a month with no motorcycle and I thought I would die," Perlin said.
