





simply crystalline bright and richly textured with astounding clarity," and "she is a Broadway pro at the height of her power."



Make New Year's Resolutions That Last

goals so hard to stick to?

The fitness instructors at the United State Karate Organization (USKO) Family Fitness Center attribute the short fitness stints to a combination of factors that discourage individuals from sticking to a long-term program that will produce results at the gym. "It comes down to discipline when you talk about getting into a fitness routine and sticking with it. In addition to karate lessons for students ranging in age from 4-65, USKO also has a full service weight gym for advanced fitness training. Also in house is a full size kickboxing center with a ring and bags for beginners through advanced students.

Joey Pagliuso, who is also a top ranked kickboxer, says that dad can hit the weights while mom works out in the cardio kickboxing program, all while the kids learn the discipline and obtain the self esteem in karate class to integrate a lifestyle of fitness and exercise that will last.

Similar to FOX's The Biggest Loser, USKO runs a "Jump Start" program designed to trim the fat fast. In an intensive program of exercise and healthy dieting, jump starters in the group work together to lose cumulative, combined weight.

Sandy Pagliuso says, "positive reinforcement is the key. We don't kick jump starters out of the program for not losing enough weight. The whole group pushes each other to continue on to the next level." Of the last four programs, jump starters have lost an average combined weight of 86 pounds. The next Jump Start program starts just in time for the New Year.

In 2005, don't let your resolutions to get back into shape wane. Make it a fun family affair, motivate each other to make exercise a part of your lifestyle, and spend that extra time with the people that matter to you the most.


