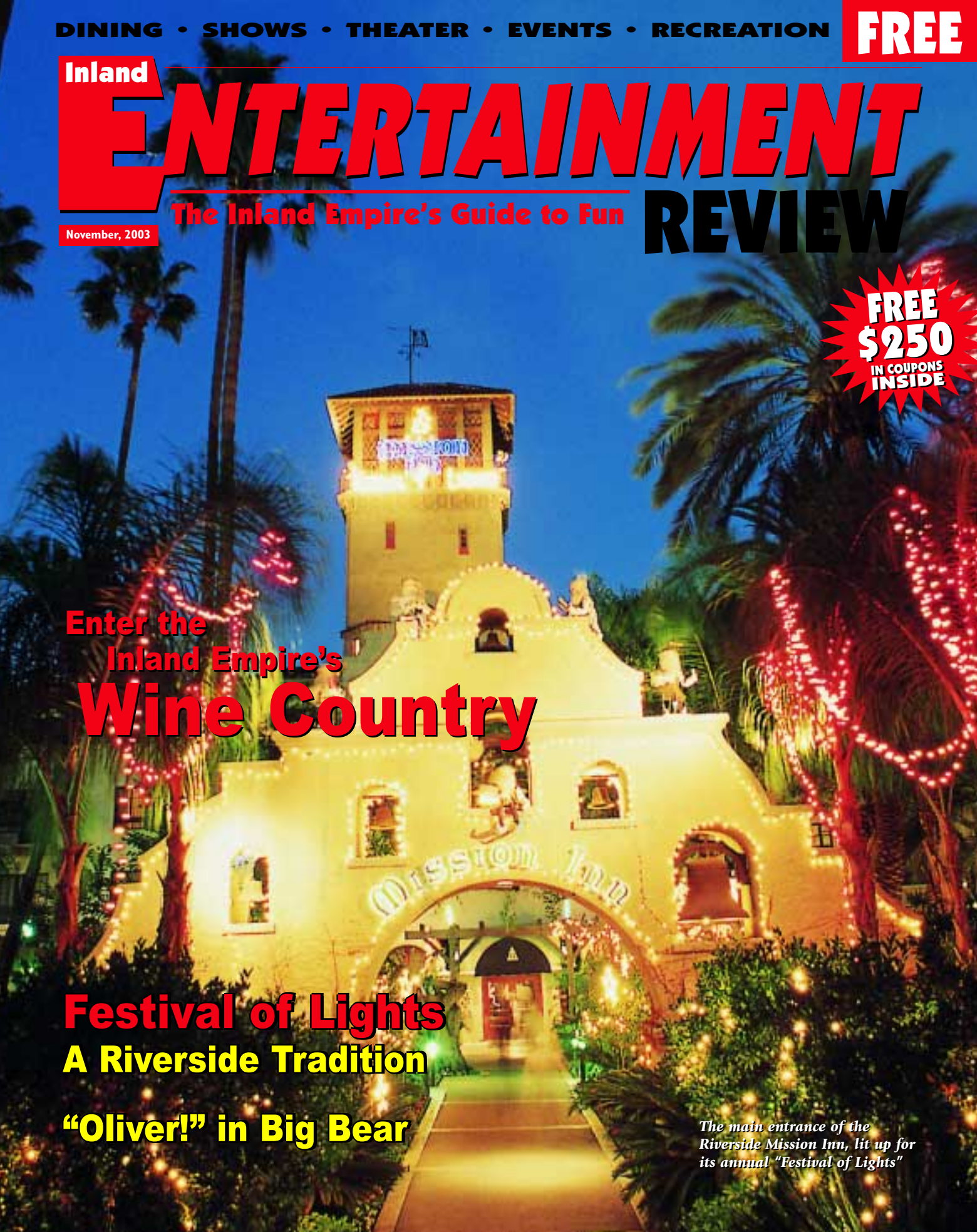

Downtown Riverside celebrates the Holidays

Downtown Riverside is booming with holiday cheer this month. Below is a smattering of what you can expect:

Each year, people come from near and far to view the millions of beautiful twinkling lights and holiday decorations that adorn the Historic Mission Inn in downtown Riverside. This annual event, known as the **Festival of Lights**, kicks off the day after Thanksgiving on Nov. 28. Read more about it on page 10.

The Riverside Downtown Partnership's theme for its holiday celebration, **Downtown Aglow**, derived from the attraction of the lighted Mission Inn and the decorative lighting



downtown. Downtown Aglow begins Saturday, Nov. 29. During Downtown Aglow, the Partnership will have entertainment on the Main Street Pedestrian Mall every weekend continuing through Dec. 23. Entertainment will include choirs, dancers and other exciting performances. Food and merchandise vendors will also be on the mall to add to the holiday spirit. For those who prefer to view the lights in style, carriage rides will be available.

As part of the Downtown Aglow promotion, the Partnership will also sponsor a "Best Lighted Window" contest for all downtown businesses. There are three categories of entries: Best Retail Store, Best Restaurant, and Best Business. Winners will be selected by the Festival of Lights committee and announced at the Festival of Lights Switch-on ceremony on Nov. 28.

On Monday, Nov. 3, a number of merchants on the Mall will be holding "Christmas Open House" to welcome

new and old customers alike. Holiday shoppers can enjoy refreshments while browsing through the many eclectic and unique specialty shops throughout downtown Riverside.

Pick up a copy of the Downtown Holiday Guide for the Downtown Aglow entertainment schedule and a list of shops and restaurants open late during the holiday season. Downtown Holiday Guides are available at the Visitors Center on Main Street at University Avenue.

A daytime holiday event is the **Orange Blossom Holiday Village** on the Main Street Pedestrian Mall between 10th St. and University Ave. every Wednesday during the month of December. On Dec. 3, 10, 17, and 24, from 10am to 2pm, enjoy live music, arts and craft fair, and a certified farmers market. You can pick up unique gifts, taste delicious snacks, and do some holiday shopping in downtown Riverside's specialty shops and boutiques.

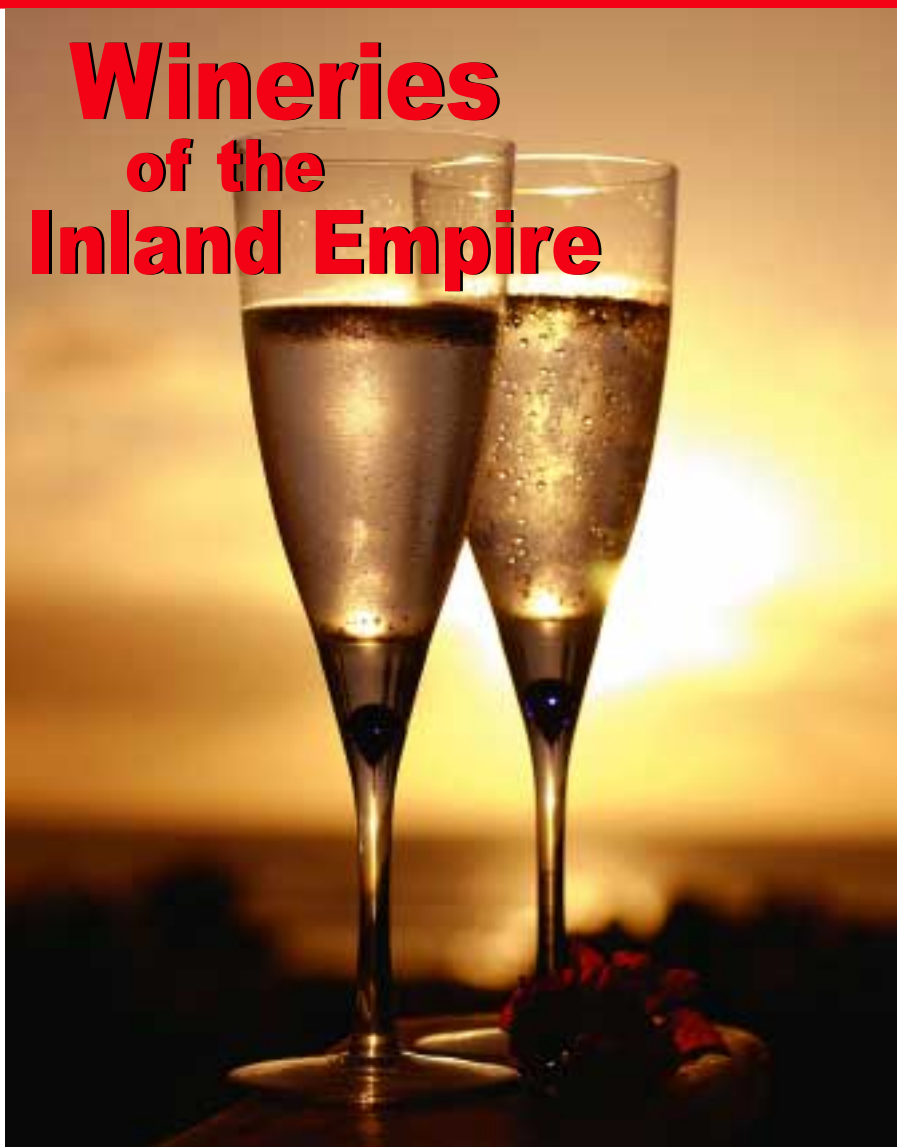

Kenny's set was revolutionary for the time, utilizing a massive series of revolving platforms and steps, which allowed one scene to slip seamlessly into another without the conventional use of blackouts and scene changes. The set was rather abstract in its appearance, allowing for a greater audience-visualizing of the starkness of the Dickensian setting." "I saw this original production of *Oliver!* on Broadway in 1964, and, to put it mildly, was blown-away by the set. I've never forgotten it. I've seen subsequent revivals in London and elsewhere, and since these productions used a more traditional approach of set dressing by the use of scenic flats, drapes, scrims and set pieces, the effect, to me, has always been disappointing."

When C.A.T.S. first decided to do *Oliver!* in 1999, Rachels vowed that since the Performing Arts Center in Big Bear Lake had a wonderful revolving stage, C.A.T.S. would try to recreate the original conceptual feeling of the original Sean Kenny set. After much research, they were able to get a line-sketch of the original set, and Co-Set Designers Tom Rachels and Joanne McMaster adapted the set for C.A.T.S. use at the PAC. This original set will be re-created for the new 2003 production. Rachels states: "I venture to say, that theater buffs who have seen revivals of *Oliver!* have not seen it like this! The set alone will be worth the price of admission."

Steve Gaghagen, who stars as Fagin, played the role for C.A.T.S. in 1999 and has played the part



professionally "off-the-hill" several times. Kim Dolan, well known as a Big Bear performing treasure, will play Nancy.
