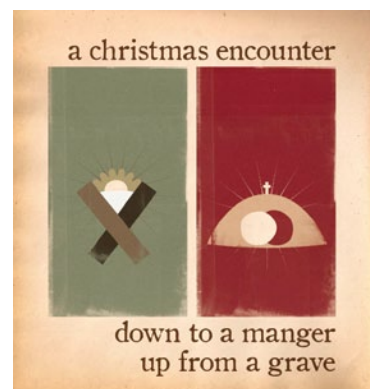
The Grove Community Church Presents: A Christmas Encounter

Snow Play After Dark for Faster Inner Tube Rides

As night arrives the lights go on and stars come out. More important, snow gets even faster, making for incredible inner tubing at Big Bear Lake's Alpine Slide at Magic Mountain, which offers the Southland's only night snow play.

Inner tubing after dark at Alpine Slide is surreal as sliders pinwheel back and forth through the shadows during their downhill descents. Always open for night snow play Fridays and Saturdays 5-9pm, the area also has extra evening sessions for the upcoming holiday season every night from Dec. 16 through Jan. 7, 2012 (except Christmas Eve and Christmas Day). Bundle up when the sun goes down for the fastest, most exhilarating rides around.

The snow is groomed prior to each night session to ensure tubers enjoy perfectly smooth corduroy on Alpine Slide's traditional downhill runs. The area is also home to the twisting, turning "Snake," a series of high-banked turns that whip riders back and forth, to and fro, like a boardercross or motocross track. As snow gets faster as the evening progresses the famous Snake gets even more bite to its ride and is especially popular with the after dark crowd.

Getting to the top of all the snow is easy thanks to Magic Carpet uphill lift...just step on

the moving conveyor belt and you're back at the top ready for more fun in a jiffy. No trying to scramble up an icy slope, which just wouldn't happen after dark. Save your energy for the thrilling downhill rides. Alpine Slide's Magic Carpet is enclosed in Plexiglass for guest comfort.

When it's time for a winter warm-up, head inside the heated base lodge with video games for hot cocoa, coffee or other goodies from the family-priced snack bar.

Night tubing is perfect for those who want to ski, snowboard, snowshoe or explore other Big Bear recreation by day. Night tubing is cheaper, too; just \$15 buys four hours of fun and includes the Magic Carpet lift pass and tube rental.

Alpine Slide and nearby Big Bear Snow Play are open daily for inner tubing from 10am to 4pm. Each make their own snow with the same Lenko fan guns used at the ski resorts to ensure there's plenty of white stuff to play on. Day sessions cost \$25 which includes Magic Carpet pass and tube rental. Guests are welcome to come and go if they want, or bring a picnic lunch and make a day of it.

Alpine Slide is also home to the signature bobsled-like ride of the same name. Experience many of the same gravitational forces Olympians

feel during your descent down two quarter-mile long cement tracks aboard sleds with ball-bearing wheels that you actually control. Go faster or slower and lean into each banked turn before tucking through the straightaways.

Alpine Slide also offers Putt 'N Around Go-Karts and an 18-hole miniature golf course and there's a terrific weekend barbecue on the outdoor deck. **IER**

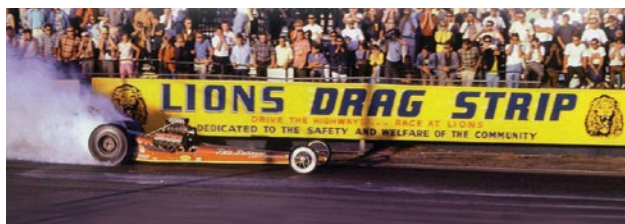

Join the 'Drag Race Reunion' at NHRA

Legendary racer Tom "The Mon-goose" McEwen has gathered some of his closest friends and is heading back to "The Beach," and you're invited! On Saturday, Dec. 3, 2-5pm, McEwen will host a Lions Last Drag Race Reunion at the Wally Parks NHRA Motorsports Museum.

Lions officially opened on October 9, 1955, actually a few weeks after the opening of another purpose built strip—San Fernando. Drag News described Lions as, "Probably one of the greatest auto racing spectacles in local history." The place was packed. The pit gates had to be closed, officials had to limit the number of runs and the parking overflowed into the



surrounding streets. Track manager Mickey Thompson announced he would double the number of bleachers.

For more than 15 years the Beach enjoyed an unrivaled reputation. Sadly, the fun ended when the Los Angeles Harbor Commission decided that it needed the land for development—it eventually became the Intermodal Container

Transfer Facility.

The "Goose," of course, went on to win Funny Car at that last race (against arch rival Prudhomme) and he will be joined in a panel discussion by other Lions Drag Strip notables including "T.V. Tommy" Ivo who (with McEwen) arguably made more runs down the Long Beach quarter-mile than any other drivers,

Pro Stock champion of The Last Drag Race Bill Bagshaw, and long time starter Larry Sutton.

Hot Rod DeLuxe magazine editor Dave Wallace will moderate, saying, "Fascination with 'The Beach' only seems to increase the further away we get. I'm really excited to moderate this discussion which I expect will be lively given the panelists."

Joining Dave and the racers will be other personalities from Lions including Gordon Browning who discovered the location and track manager Mickey Thompson's wife Judy and son Danny.

Wally Parks NHRA Motorsports Museum

Founded in 1998 and named for the founder of the National Hot Rod Association, the Wally Parks NHRA Motorsports Museum, presented by Automobile Club of Southern California, houses the very roots of hot rodding. Scores of famous vehicles spanning American motorsports history are on display, including winning cars representing 50 years of drag racing, dry lakes and salt-flat racers, oval track challengers and exhibits describing their colorful backgrounds. The Wally Parks NHRA Motorsports Museum is open Wednesday through Sunday, 10am to 5pm. Current NHRA members are admitted free and Auto Club members enjoy a \$2 discount. Admission for non-members is \$8 for adults, \$6 for seniors 60 and older, \$6 for juniors six through 15, and free for children under the age of five. The Museum is also available for special group tours. The Wally Parks NHRA Motorsports Museum is located at Fairplex Gate 1, 1101 W. McKinley Ave. in Pomona. Travel back to the fabulous aircraft of the '30s

"Fabulous Aircraft of the 1930s" will be the subject of the Living History Flying Event hosted by the Planes of Fame Air Museum at the Chino Airport on Saturday, Jan. 7, 2012. This first monthly Planes of Fame Air Museum Living History Flying Event of 2012 will begin at 10am with a seminar describing the strides aviation made in the 1930s and conclude with a flight demonstration by a Planes of Fame Air Museum warbird.

Almost certainly the most colorful era in the history of aviation, the 1930s saw aircraft designs transition from wood and fabric open-cockpit biplanes slowed down by struts, wires and fixed landing gear, to sleek all-metal monoplanes featuring retractable landing gear and fully enclosed cockpits and cabins.

The 1930s was also the decade when modern airline transportation came of age. Furthermore, it was an era when many of those aircraft, including military types, sported wonderfully colorful and varied color schemes.

An independent, non-profit institution dedicated to preserving and inspiring interest in aviation, educating the public and honoring aviation pioneers and veterans, Planes of Fame Air Museum was the first permanent air museum in the American West and pioneer in the concept of restoring historic display aircraft to flying condition. Staffed primarily by a core of dedicated volunteers, the museum supports its daily operations with donations, admission fees, facilities rentals and proceeds from the use of its aircraft and artifacts in various productions.

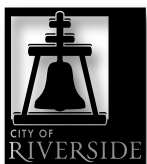

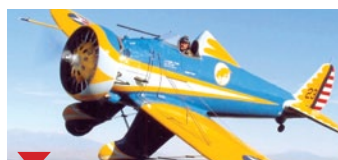

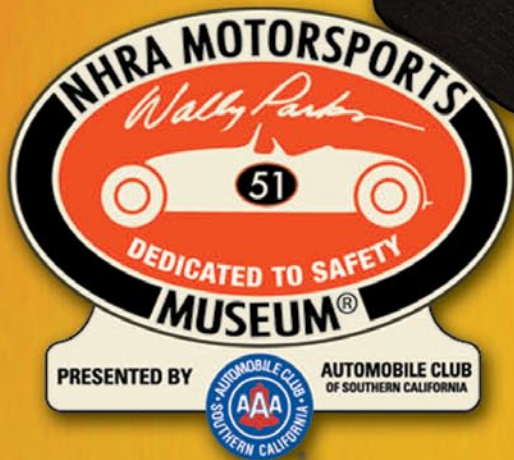
