



With continued state budget cuts, the Alumni Association continues to fund student programs and projects that College of the Desert would be unable to provide otherwise. This year the COD





Airshow 2013 – 'Lightning Strikes Chino'

The Planes of Fame Airshow at Chino Airport



arbirds will once again fill the skies over Chino Airport during the Planes of Fame Air Show over the weekend of May 4-5. The 2013 Air Show will celebrate the Lockheed P-38 Lightning and the pilots who flew them.

On May 3, the public and museum members are invited to an Airshow Preview Event consisting of aircraft arrivals and practice flights. Get all the details for these events from the website at www.planesoffame.org.

Development on the P-38 Lightning began in 1937, in response to a USAF request for a high performance fighter with plenty of firepower. Lockheed's Hal Hibbard and Kelly Johnson designed a twin-boom aircraft with tricycle landing gear and turbo-superchargers for increased performance at high altitudes. The P-38 was also the first U.S. fighter to incorporate a tricycle landing gear.

P-38 Lightnings were used as escort fighters, bombers, pathfinders, night fighters, and photo reconnaissance aircraft. P-38s were flown in every theatre of WW2. Their long range allowed them to escort heavy bombers over Europe and to cover the large distances between islands in the Pacific. Richard Bong, America's highestscoring ace in WW2, achieved all 40 of his victories flying P-38s. And it was a flight of P-38s that, in April 1943, shot down Admiral Yamamoto, the man who planned the attack on Pearl Harbor. Only about a half dozen of flyable P-38s remain today.

Many other warbirds, historic




The Planes of Fame P-38 Lightning will take to the skies with up to 4 other P-38's on May 4th and 5th in Chino.

aircraft, modern military aircraft and aerobatic planes will make the 2013 Planes of Fame Air Show the Southern California and World Aviation event of the year. Adding excitement to the program of warbird flybys and air combat re-enactments will be high performance aerobatic displays. A tribute to all veterans will be performed by the U.S. Air Force Heritage Flight display Team. Other aircraft, military vehicles, and aviation-related items will be on static display for up-close viewing. There will even be opportunities for the public to experience Planes of Fame Air Museum member orientation flights in genuine warbirds. Numerous food and beverage vendors will delight the palette and a host of memorabilia vendors will be on hand to make the overall experience even more enjoyable for Air Show visitors.

The Planes of Fame Air Museum, founded in 1957 by Edward Maloney, is where aviation history lives. It is the oldest independently operated aviation museum in the United States. The museum collection spans the history of manned flight from the Chanute Hang Glider of 1896 to the space age Apollo Capsule. The mission of Planes of Fame Air Museum is to preserve aviation history, inspire

interest in aviation, educate the public, and honor aviation pioneers and veterans. The Museum sponsors regular events in the form of inspirational experiences, educational presentations, flight demonstrations, and air shows in fulfillment of this mission.



Doobie Brothers Play At Riverside's Fox

than 40 million albums worldwide throughout its career. The group was inducted into The Vocal Group Hall of Fame in 2004. On April 13, The Doobie Brothers, with special guests Chris Thayer Band, will perform at the Fox Performing Arts Center in Riverside.

Their second album, Toulouse Street (which spawned the hits and classic rock staples, "Listen to the Music" and "Jesus Is Just Alright") brought the band their breakthrough success after its release in July, 1972. In collaboration with manager Bruce Cohn, producer Ted Templeman and engineer Donny Landee, the band put forward a more polished and eclectic set of songs. Pianist Bill Payne of Little Feat contributed keyboards for the first time, beginning a decades-long collaboration that included many recording sessions and even a two-week stint touring with the band in early 1974. With an improved rhythm section and the songwriting of Johnston and Simmons, the Doobies' trademark sound—an amalgam of R&B, country, bluegrass, hard rock, roadhouse boogie, funk, and rock and roll—emerged fully formed.

A string of hits followed, including

Johnston's "Long Train Running" and "China Grove," from the 1973 album *The Captain and Me*. Other noteworthy songs on the album were Simmons' country-ish ode "South City Midnight Lady" and the explosive, hard rocking raveup "Without You," for which the entire band received songwriting credit.



Perhaps the greatest tribute to Mariachi Reyna de Los Angeles, the first all female mariachi in the United States, is that now there actually are other all-female mariachi groups. It is the growing proof that when mariachi Maestro Jose Hernandez created Reyna de Los Angeles, it wasn't a novelty, it was a genre.

Reyna, which was formed in



1994, has taken the history of women in mariachi music from being solely singers to being the full complement of musical performers. The compliments have not stopped. In a musical landscape where songs are often written by men, about male perspectives, Reyna has created its own history. That history had the best of

Big Bear Play Explores Shakespearian Mystery

ATS, the Community Arts Theater Society of Big Bear Valley, presents the world premiere production of the original Mark Twain And The Shakespeare Mystery. Written by and starring Robin Field, the production asks, who really wrote Shakespeare's plays and poems?

Mark Twain And The Shakespeare Mystery goes for a limited run at The CATS Warehouse Theater, April 5-14.



TWAIN IN DOUBT Mark Twain had his doubts about the actual author of Shakespeare's works.

Field, who has portrayed Twain on stage before, has adapted Twain's 1909 book *Is Shakespeare Dead?* into an original one-man, one act show asking the question that Twain posed: Who really wrote Shakespeare's plays and poems? Mark Twain was one of the first celebrities to doubt that it was the Stratford actor. Over a hundred years later, evidence is mounting that Twain was right.

Mark Twain And The Shakespeare Mystery opens at the CATS Warehouse Theater, and will play seven performances on April 5, 6, 10, 12, 13 at 7:30pm and on April 7 and 14 at 2:30pm. Open seating is limited and advance ticket purchase is suggested.

Field, who has recorded many of Twain's classic works as audio books, says: "Playing Twain on stage is a joy, especially when he gets on such an angry, funny rant, as he does in this work. Writing his autobiography near the end of his life, Twain devoted several chapters to this issue. Then he decided to publish them as a separate book. This information has never been presented on stage before. The other 'celebrities' who have shared Twain's doubts include Charles Dickens, Walt Whitman, Ralph Waldo Emerson, Henry James, psychologist Sigmund Freud, actors Charlie Chaplin, Orson Welles, John Gielgud and Derek Jacobi."

But, as Field says, "Twain knew none of this new evidence. So my script presents only what Twain wrote in 1909."

The one-act play, suitable for the whole family, runs about ninety minutes, and is guaranteed to make you laugh and leave you wondering: Was Twain right? You decide.

First 5 San Bernardino Invests In Improving Oral Health Outcomes For Children 0-5

ooth decay remains high in prevalence for children ages 2-5, a fact that fuels the many public health messages shared during National Children's Dental Health Month observed each year in February. California ranked the third-worst state in the nation for dental decay among kindergartners, according to a 2007 study from Center for Oral Health. Locally, First 5 San Bernardino has taken action to address improved oral health in children from prenatal stages to age 5, by investing \$5,536,965 in Oral Health initiatives that range from funding maternal oral health education to strengthening the network that ensures access to dental care providers.

The Children and Families Commission for San Bernardino County (First 5 San Bernardino) was created in December, 1998, in order to realize the benefits of Proposition 10 (California Children and Families Act) for the County's youngest residents and their families. The act created a system of programs for the purpose of promoting, supporting, and improving the early development of children

from the prenatal stage to five years of age.

First 5's investment into support services, community outreach and evaluation, made it possible that 65% of children ages 0-5, who were enrolled in First 5 San Bernardino dental programs, were able to visit a dental care provider for the first time.

Access to a dental care provider is one of the most significant barriers to the proactive management and preventative treatment of oral health issues. Coupled with misconceptions of how and when to address optimum oral health, expecting parents miss opportunities to protect themselves and their unborn children from detrimental attacks to their mouth, causing alarm for many health and dental professionals as patients frequently require care in devastating stages of preventable oral diseases.

First 5 San Bernardino's Oral Health programs conducted dental exams for more than 1,400 children and 900 parents between 2011-2012, creating access for families to receive regular dental care and access to information

on oral health to improve positive outcomes at home.

First 5 San Bernardino Executive Director Karen Scott comments, "We are hopeful about the results we are seeing from this health initiative and can only anticipate continued growth in this investment. A child's good oral health condition goes beyond their budding smiles; it helps them to function attentively at school, influences positive diet choices, and helps families' bottom-line in health care expenses. Minority children and children of low-income families are affected disproportionately by oral health challenges, and our investments are resources to provide the relief and support services they need to continue thriving as a family."







Composer, Singer, Actor, Pepe Aguilar Brings His Celebrated Latin Music To Fantasy Springs


