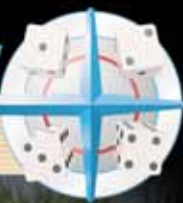

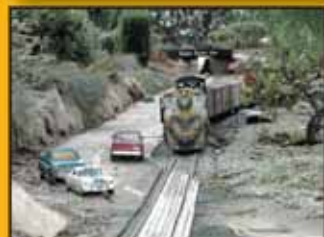

Tickets for the Legends of Wrestling and Lupillo Rivera shows are available at Ticketmaster.

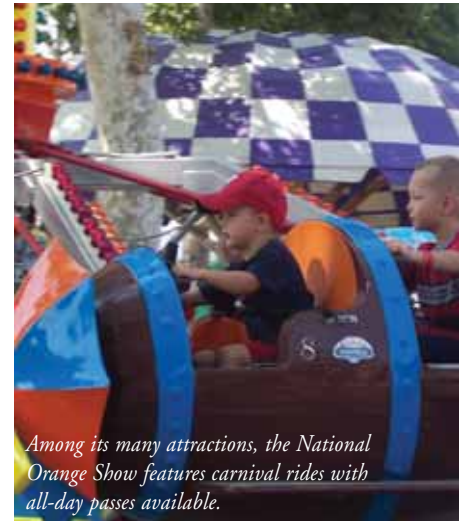

'Thunder' a moving tribute to veterans

Rev up your engine for those who died to defend our country. Memorial Day, Monday, May 28, marks the eighth annual West Coast Thunder motorcycle ride supporting the Riverside National Cemetery. Since the ride's inception in 2000 more than \$150,000 has been donated to the Riverside National Cemetery for their Memorial Monuments programs.

Comprised of thousands of Veterans, their families and friends, and many others who support those who have served our nation, this annual motorcycle ride has become a highly anticipated event for the Riverside community. Departing from Skip Fordyce Harley-Davidson at 7688 Indiana Ave., Riverside at 9:11am more than 6,000 motorcycles wind through numerous residential neighborhoods on their way to the Riverside National Cemetery located off of Van Buren Blvd.

Mayor Ron Loveridge will once again represent the City of Riverside as the Grand Marshal. The mayor is followed first by an array of motorcycles representing West Coast Thunder's Color Guard and Honor Guard who perform very moving ceremonies, both at Skip Fordyce and at



the National Cemetery.

Led by a vintage and fully restored Viet Nam era Huey H-1 Helicopter provided by Wings and Rotors Museum out of French Valley airport, the parade runs along Indiana Avenue, North-East to Arlington. Turning east and proceeding to Alessandro Blvd. then turning south the ride continues south to Trautwein Rd. then south to Van Buren Blvd East and into the cemetery.

Thousands of patriotic citizens and their families line the parade route each year, waving American Flags and cheering in support of this great tribute. The entire event is coordinated by the Riverside Police Department maximizing rider and pedestrian safety, while minimizing traf-

fic congestion along the parade route.

Once the parade route reaches the cemetery, a Memorial Ceremony will be conducted by the National Cemetery.

From there everyone is invited to downtown Riverside as West Coast Thunder continues the day with a fun filled tribute that includes live entertainment, vendors, food and a festival atmosphere in the streets of downtown Riverside. The West Coast Thunder downtown event takes place on Main Street between 10th and 12th streets. The downtown event concludes at 4pm. Admission is free.

Motorcycle riders interested in joining the ride can go to www.skipfordyce.com or www.westcoastthunder.com to register. All proceeds from the ride go directly to the Riverside National Cemetery. All motorcycles are welcome. Online pre-registration ends May 17. After that date you can register at Skip Fordyce Harley-Davidson up to and including the day of the event, or at Corona Harley-Davidson located at 2410 Wardlow Road in Corona up until Friday, May 25. 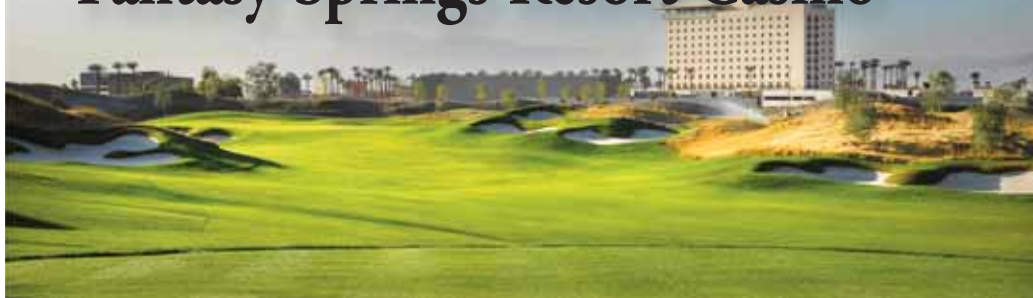



Astronomy Village celebrates anniversary

Twenty-one years ago Halley's Comet passed by Earth, dazzling the scientific community and amateur enthusiasts with a spectacular show. The year was 1986. The predictable but rare return of the comet (which passes by Earth every 76 years) was the inspiration for a small group of local mountain residents to form the Mountain Skies

Astronomical Society (MSAS). They recognized the outstanding advantage that clear, dark mountain skies offered for celestial observation and wanted to offer the public the opportunity to make astronomy a personal experience. In 1989 MSAS was born as a non profit, public benefit corporation.

In 1999 MSAS celebrated the grand opening of Astronomy Village. The Robert Brownlee Observatory was built on the premises a year later, housing a customized Schmidt-Cassegrain telescope with a go-to system and an extensive library of objects.

Today the MSAS Astronomy Village hosts an annual attendance of thousands of school children as well as community groups, outdoor camps, engineering associations, universities, and the general public. The programs are designed and supervised by professional scientists and educators. MSAS maintains a 24 hour sky and event report and a highly informative web site at www.mountain-skies.org. The Society contributes educational material to numerous publications throughout the year. MSAS is a designated educational partner of NASA, United States Geological

Survey, Jet Propulsion Laboratory, Boeing, and Scripps Institute of Oceanography, Geophysics, and Planetary Physics and many more.

It only seems fitting that another spectacular comet, Comet McNaught, has recently made its appearance in our skies, heralding MSAS's eighteenth year celebration. If you haven't had the opportunity to visit the MSAS Astronomy Village, spring is a great time to do so. The coming months are perfect for enjoying the butterfly garden and dramatic mountain vistas surrounding the facility. MSAS will give away special items in celebration of their anniversary during programs throughout the month of May.

SkyQuest Public Programs for May include "The Moon, Our Nearest Neighbor" May 5, "Spring Constellations" May 12, "Today's Universe" May 19, and "How to Use a Telescope" May 26. Program times are 7-9pm and include a slide/lecture, question and answer period, laser tour of the night sky, and a trip to the Robert Brownlee Observatory, weather permitting.
