Sir Alfred Joseph Hitchcock was an English Film director and producer. He pioneered many techniques in the suspense and psychological thriller genres.

Hitchcock directed more than fifty feature films in a career spanning six decades and is often regarded as the greatest British filmmaker. The magazine MovieMaker has described him as the most influential filmmaker of all time, and he is widely regarded as one of cinema's most significant artists.

Through his cameo appearances in his own films, interviews, film trailers, and the television program Alfred Hitchcock Presents, he became a cultural icon.

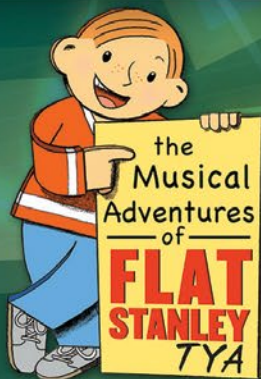

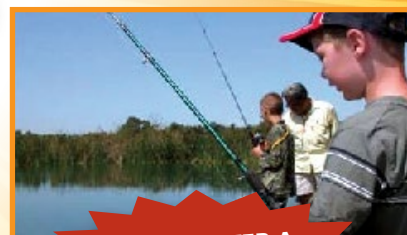

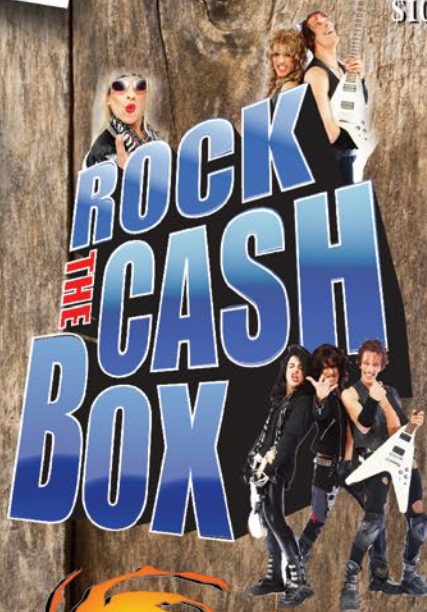

Wet Or Dry, Rides Are Fun And Fast At Alpine Slide

Wet or dry, the rides are always fast at Alpine Slide at Magic Mountain in beautiful, close-to-home Big Bear Lake.

Beat summer heat on Alpine Slide's refreshing double water slide, two flumes of cool, cascading water that whip riders back and forth before splashing them into the solar-heated pool at the bottom. Each flume is filled with an array of turns and straightaways for an exciting trek that's a great way to cool off on a warm day. Sit up and go slower or lay back and become a human torpedo shooting through the flumes.

Alpine Slide's water slide is as affordable as it is fun. An all-day pass costs just \$15, while 10 rides are \$10 and individual trips are only two bucks each. As always at Alpine Slide, parents who don't want to play don't have to pay to get in, many opting to read or relax while they turn the kids loose.

Alpine Slide, open weekends till

June 8 and then daily, is famous for its Olympicstyle bobsleds, in season all year long. Snow is never needed since the sleds have teflon runners and ball-bearing wheels, and the quarter-mile long tracks with banked turns and long straightaways are cement. Riders control their own speed with the brake, and unlike amusement park rides, each trip down is a completely unique and interactive experience. Lean into each turn and go into a tuck through straightaways to experience what it's like to be an Olympic bobsledder, or use the brake to go slow and soak in views of the lake and mountains.

For a relaxing change of pace enjoy a round on the Putt 'N Around miniature golf course, laden with rolling greens, water hazards, even penalty-stroke "sand traps."

Then for more fast fun, ride the Putt 'N Around Go-Karts, each equipped with 5.5 horsepower Honda motors and an array of safety features including three-point

harness restraints, hydraulic disk brakes, rack and pinion steering and padded steering wheels. The tire-lined track sports hair pin and high banked turns as riders circle under the pines at 7,000 foot elevation.

Alpine Slide has a recently remodeled base lodge where guests escape the sun with a video arcade and family-priced snack bar that includes an old-fashioned Blue Bunny ice cream counter. Every window has a view of the action outside.

The fast times continue after dark on Fridays and Saturdays at

Alpine Slide all summer long as the area stays open for fun under the stars until 9pm. New for 2013 are Senior Days on Wednesdays—seniors get a free ice cream when they purchase a round of miniature golf. **IER**

Fair, Bears, and More At Alpine Zoo

The Big Bear Alpine Zoo in Big Bear Lake has a lot going on this summer and makes a great family mountain escape. An "alpine wildlife sanctuary," the zoo is home to nearly 200 rescued mountain animals.

Since 1959 the Big Bear Alpine Zoo (formerly the Moonridge Animal Park) has been practicing the three R's, "Rescue, Rehabilitation and Release." Whenever possible, any injured or orphaned wild animal brought into the zoo is given a second chance to live free. When an animal is too compromised to exist without help they are given a home for life.

The zoo is also home to a three-legged black bear, Hucklebeary; a blind bald eagle, Valentine; two orphaned mountain lion sisters, Canyon and Cascade, and many other wonderful creatures whose lives depend on the dedicated care given by Curator Debbie Richardson and her staff.

Big Bear Alpine Zoo is open daily, 10am to 5pm for the summer (through September, Labor Day weekend).

Tutu is the mother of the zoo's other two grizzlies, Harley and Ayla. She and the babies arrived in 1996, when she was almost 13 years old. Her two babies were about 6 months old at the time of arrival to their new home. Tutu was a three strikes bear, she had raided campsites and bakeries, she had bluff charged people and she was teaching her offspring to do the same. They relocated her three times and she kept coming back with the same behaviors. Someone had to take her and the babies or they would be euthanized. So the Big Bear Alpine Zoo agreed to take all of them and built an exhibit, thanks to an outpouring of many donations, while Woodland Park Zoo held them. They are the only family of Grizzly Bears together in captivity in all of California.

The zoo is very happy to have Grizzly Bears because Big Bear was named after them. They were hunted to extinction in the early 1900's in the Big Bear Valley.

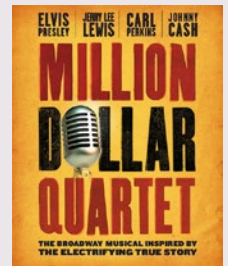

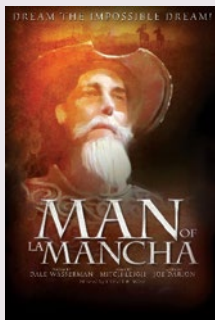

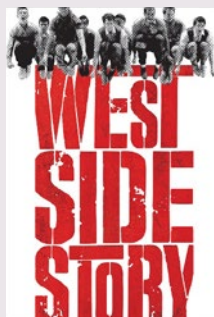

Classic Alfred Hitchcock Comes To Riverside's Fox Arts Center

The Fox Performing Arts Center in Riverside presents a summer film festival featuring the Classic Films of Alfred Hitchcock, the most widely known and influential director in the history of world cinema, with a significant body of work produced over 50 years.

The Film Festival will begin on Friday, July 19 and run every Friday night through August 30 at 7:30pm at the Fox Performing Arts Center, 3801 Mission Inn Ave. in Riverside.

Sir Alfred Joseph Hitchcock was an English film director and producer. He pioneered many techniques in the suspense and psychological thriller genres. After a successful career in British cinema in both silent films and early talkies, billed as England's best director, Hitchcock moved to Hollywood in 1939.

Over a career spanning more than half a century, Hitchcock fashioned for himself a distinctive and recognizable directorial style. He pioneered the use of a camera made to move in a way that mimics a person's gaze, forcing viewers to engage in a form of voyeurism. He framed shots to maximize anxiety, fear, or empathy, and used innovative film editing. His stories often feature fugitives on the run from the law alongside "icy blonde" female characters. Many of Hitchcock's films have twist endings and thrilling plots featuring depictions of violence, murder, and crime. Many of the mysteries, however, are used as decoys or "MacGuffins" that serve the film's themes and the psychological examinations of the characters. Hitchcock's films also borrow many themes from psychoanalysis and feature strong sexual overtones. Through his cameo appearances in his own films, interviews, film trailers, and the television program *Alfred Hitchcock Presents*, he became a cultural icon.

Hitchcock directed more than fifty feature films in a career spanning six decades. Often regarded as the greatest British filmmaker, he came first in a 2007 poll of film critics in Britain's *Daily Telegraph*, which said: "Unquestionably the greatest filmmaker to emerge from these islands, Hitchcock did more than any director to shape modern cinema, which would be utterly different without him. His flair was for narrative, cruelly withholding crucial information (from his characters and from us) and engaging the emotions of the audience like no one else."

The magazine *MovieMaker* has described him as the most influential filmmaker of all time, and he is widely regarded as one of cinema's most significant artists.

Musical Comedy Wins With 'Triumph Of Love' At Riverside Community Players



Summer is the season for musicals and it is no different at Riverside Community Players, presenting *Triumph of Love*, July 12-28. Doesn't ring a bell, you say? This petite chamber musical is one that doesn't see production very often. The theaters which produce musicals would find the show too small and without the requisite tap dancing and chorus girls, but summer audiences will find their

summer musical check list very well completed with romance, broad comedy, and buffoonery aplenty.

Don't think for a moment that *Triumph of Love* is stuffy or stodgy. In fact, the evening comes with a "for mature audiences" caveat because of the very bawdy nature of the characters. The main character, Leonide-the Spartan princess (Kara Masek), infiltrates a garden of philosophy run by two very grim philosopher siblings (Vil Towers and Charlotte McKensie) where the object of her affection, Agis (Tyler Boyd) studies rational thought and assassination techniques - I told you it was a comedy. The princess is attended by a very saucy servant (Ashleigh Coe), as are the "family that time forgot" by Harlequin (Michael Eastman) and the gardener Dimas (Michael Hunter).

Mistaken identities, assumed identities (the girls pretend to be men with varying degrees of success), assignations, true love, and pretend love all combine to make a silly, funny evening with great music and lots of fun. Director Patricia Scarborough guarantees a good time by all.

Triumph is a musical version of Pierre Marivaux's famous comedy *The Triumph of Love*, which was very popular at the Paris Theatre de Itallienne where Marivaux was a favorite son for most of his career. Marivaux was known for his saucy comedies based on the Italian performance style Commedia dell'Arte, featuring comic stock characters (Harlequin), broad physical humor, and improvisation. The only feature not surviving is the improvisation aspect as scripts started to be codified in the early 18th century.

Triumph of Love began life as a Broadway musical in 1997, starring such luminaries as Betty Buckley (*Cats*), F. Murray Abraham (*Amadeus*), and Susan Egan (*Beauty and the Beast*) but lasted only about 3 months. Perhaps Broadway wasn't ready for a musical with 7 cast members and no big chorus or flashy gimmicks.

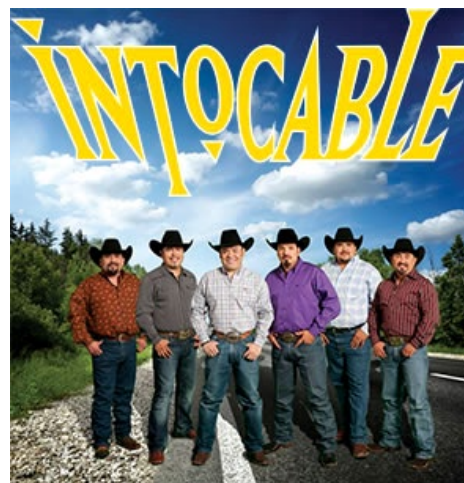

Intocable is a Tejano/Norteño musical group from Zapata, Texas that was started by friends Ricky Muñoz and René Martínez in the early 90's. Within a couple years as a band, Intocable had already risen to the top of the Tejano and Norteño fields with a musical signature that had fused Tejano's robust conjunto and Norteño folk rhythms with a pop balladry.

Currently, Intocable could very well be the most influential group in Tejano, and their tough Tejano/Norteño fusion has become the blueprint for dozens of Tex-Mex groups. The group's strengths, which include romantic hooky melodies, and tight instrumentation and vocal harmony is consistently being imitated by a list of other Tejano and Norteño groups.

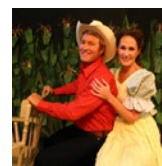

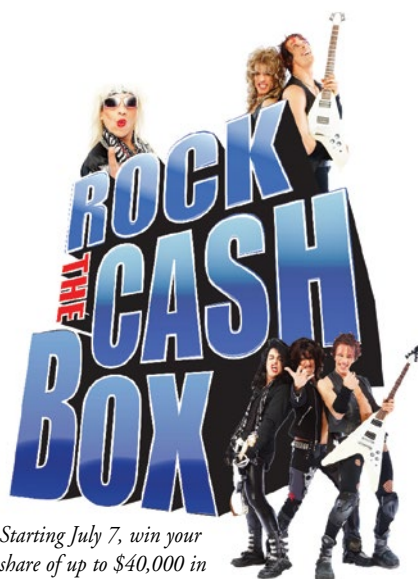
